The \$250,000 award was bestowed last year on critic and author Terry Teachout by the Lynde and Harry Bradley Foundation, which annually presents up to four awards to "individuals of extraordinary talent and dedication."

Currently the drama critic for the *Wall Street Journal*, he's also written three opera libretti and a play, "<u>Satchmo</u> at the Waldorf," which just finished a successful off-Broadway run.
